

Examples: *Capitalism: an economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state.*

Good: an integrated political-economic system which is based on the idea of 'creative destruction' and competition which rewards innovation and ingenuity while discouraging stagnation.

Less Good: a system of economics and politics here private owners control trade and industry for profit.

## Historical Figures - EXPLANATIONS

- Min. 30 words (3 marks)

### Example:

Tommy Douglas represents the idea of socialism as he was ultimately responsible for introducing public health care to Canada through the Cooperative Commonwealth Federation (CCF), which was a prototypical manifestation of socialism in modern Canadian society.

- **Looking For:** accuracy of example & full name provided, clear statement of this person's significance to the idea, consistency of sources. [3 marks]

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- Good quality: Tommy Douglas represents the idea of socialism as he was ultimately responsible for introducing public health care to Canada through the Cooperative Commonwealth Fund (CCF), which is a prototypical manifestation of socialism in modern Canadian society.
- Moderate Quality: Tommy Douglas was inspired by the ideas of Communism/Marxism in Canada in the 19th century, adopting his own version of the idea.
- Lower Quality: Tommy Douglas reformulated Communism/Marxism in Canada in the 19th century.

# PART II - EXAMPLES


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- Example: (good quality) The idea of communism/Marxism constituted the basis of Tommy Douglas' belief in the right of Canadians to enjoy uninhibited access to social services, such as healthcare, daycare, pensions, and welfare.
  - Moderate Quality: Communism/Marxism inspired Tommy Douglas to form the Cooperative Commonwealth Federation (CCF).
  - Lower Quality: Communism/Marxism inspired the formation of the Cooperative Commonwealth Federation in Canada.

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
